A team of Oudomxay provincial hospital and Nga district hospital, in cooperation with Lao Rehabilitation Foundation provided health care for dental, ear nose and throat, eye diseases, and examined expectant mothers, adults (internal medicine) and treated pediatric diseases at Nasal health center in Nga district of Oudomxay province for 4 days, May 23 to 26, 2017. The team serviced all patients free of charge, with the support of Lao Rehabilitation Foundation (LRF) in association with Fred Hollows Foundation (FHF). The details are as follows:

I. <u>TITLE</u>

Mobile Health Care for Dental, Ear Nose and Throat, Eye Diseases, Adult Internal Medicine, Expectant Mothers and Pediatric Services in the Remote Area of Nga district.

II. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Nga district is one of 7 districts of ODX province. The district is located in high mountains. The polulation numbers 30,759 people (2014), it includes 57%

LaoTheung (Khmou), 23% LaoLoum and 20 % LaoSoong (Hmong). The economy is mainly agricultural and farming.

Health care in Nga district is provided by 9 health centers covering 52 villages.

Nasal is one of the 9 health center of Nga district, it covers 3 villages with a catchment population of 2,644 that include Lao Loum, Khmou and Hmong. 98% of the land is in high mountains. The center is located at 75 Km from Nga city and is accessible by dirt road only (3.5 hours drive).

The main activities of the health centers are disease prevention, health education, vaccine injections, dispensing vitamin A and parasite medication, providing basic treatment and referring difficult cases to the district hospitals. Unfortunately, doctors and diagnostic equipment are severely limited.

This was LRF's seventh mobile health care mission at health center level.



III. OBJECTIVE

- Decrease the prevalence of blindness, deafness, dental cavities and the maternal-infant mortality rate.
- Broaden the coverage of health services for people in remote areas, ethnic minority groups and the urban poor.
- Provide human resource development for the health center staff by a donation of medical equipment and training.

IV. LOCATION AND DURATION

Serviced for 04 days (May 23-26, 2017) at Nasal Health Center (Nasal village).

VII. INSTRUMENTS AND MEDICINE

This mission was performed with the use of quality manual and automated equipment intended for mobile healthcare and effective medicines for treatment. This included:

- 2. Instruments and medicine for ENT services
- 3. Instruments and medicine for eye services
- 4. Instrument and medicine for adult internal medicine services
- 5. Instruments and medicine for expectant mothers services
- 6. Instruments and medicine for pediatric services
- 7. School supplies, toothpaste and toothbrushes for students

X. <u>RESULTS</u>

A total of 1,568 cases (female: 833 or 53.12%) were treated free of charge without regard to gender, age, ethnicity or religion. Services included:

21 pregnant patients were examined by echography. All pregnancies were normal, however all patients received vitamin and were advised to follow up at the health center or district hospital.

7. Primary School Screening Results:

196 children (F 74) were advised how to brush teeth.

- All children received toothbrushes and toothpaste.
- Educational supplies were also donated to students.

8. District Hospital Development Activities Performed

Medical equipment was provided to Nasal health center, it included: small surgery set, delivery set, nebulizer, weight scale (adult & enfant), otoscope, sphygmomanometer, temperature (digital), kidney trays, IV poles, fetal doppler, suction balls, life box (oximetry) with adult, pediatric and neonate sensors, suction pump, thumb oxymeters, other necessary medical equipment and a stock of varied medicine. LRF, Dr. Luc Janssens also provided training in the use and maintenance of the donated equipment.

9. Rehabilitation activities performed

A young boy diagnosed with a large vesical calculus was referred to Oudomxay provincial hospital for surgery treatment with the support of LRF.

VIII. BUDGET AND EXPENDITURE

The total anticipated budget: 18,944 USD. The total actual expenditure: 12,942 USD.

IX. ACCOMPLISHMENTS, WEAKNESSES AND RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Accomplishments

- Good cooperation with head of village, villagers and health center staff.
- Poor patients who otherwise would not have access to healthcare in remote areas have received treatment.
- We contributed to the prevention of ear and dental diseases; we restored or improved visual ability and helped decreasing infant and maternal mortality.
- We have improved the sustainability of health care at health center by providing basic and modern medical equipment to Nasal health center.

2. <u>Weaknesses</u>

- Beginning of the rainy season made access on dirt road difficult and distance from Oudomxay made driving time to health center substantial.
- Too many patients for adult medicine came without a clear complaint and took time away from those who really needed to be seen and treated by a limited team of internal medicine doctors.
- Time was too short to service a considerable amount of patients. One Khamou village was closed for a traditional ghost ritual; villagers were not allowed to leave the village to visit the health center.

X. NEXT MISSION PLANNING

- Provide mobile health care for dental, ENT, eye, adult, expectant mother and infectious disease in children at one or two Health Center in Oudomxay before the end of 2017.
- Will increase teamwork and time for service.
