A team of Oudomxay provincial hospital in cooperation with Lao Rehabilitation Foundation provided health care for dental, ear nose and throat, eye diseases, examined expectant mothers and treated pediatric diseases at NamHeng and Tangkok health centers in Xay district of Oudomxay province for 4 days, February 08 to 11, 2018. The team serviced all patients free of charge, with the support of Lao Rehabilitation Foundation (LRF) in association with Fred Hollows Foundation (FHF). The details are as follows:

I. <u>TITLE</u>

Mobile Health Care for Dental, Ear Nose and Throat, Eye Diseases, Expectant Mothers and Pediatric Services in the Remote Area of Xay district.

II. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

NamHeng and Tangkok are two of the 7 health center of Xay district, it covers 17 villages with a catchment population of 7,612 that include Khmou 90% and Hmong 10%. 98% of the land is in high mountains. The centers are located at remote areas and are accessible by dirt road.

The main activities of the health centers are disease prevention, health education, vaccine injections, dispensing vitamin A and parasite medication, providing basic treatment and referring difficult cases to the district hospitals. Unfortunately, doctors and diagnostic equipment are severely limited.

This was LRF's eighth mobile health care mission at health center level.

III. OBJECTIVE

- Decrease the prevalence of blindness, deafness, dental cavities and the maternal-infant mortality rate.
- Broaden the coverage of health services for people in remote areas, ethnic minority groups and the urban poor.
- Provide human resource development for the health center staff by a donation of medical equipment and training.
- Provide health care development for the health centers by a donation of medical equipment and training.

VII. INSTRUMENTS AND MEDICINE

This mission was performed with the use of quality manual and automated equipment intended for mobile healthcare and effective medicines for treatment. This included:

Services were provided in 6 main activities, for a total of 739 cases (female: 279 or 37.75%) were treated free of charge without regard to gender, age, ethnicity or religion. Services included:

IX. ACCOMPLISHMENTS, WEAKNESSES AND RECOMMENDATIONS

1. Accomplishments

- Poor patients who otherwise would not have access to healthcare in remote areas have received treatment.
- We contributed to the prevention of ear and dental diseases; we restored or improved visual ability and helped decreasing infant and maternal mortality.
- We have improved the sustainability of health care at health centers by providing basic and modern medical equipment to NamHeng and Tangkok health centers.

2. <u>Weaknesses</u>

- This mission did not provide internal medicine for adult services which is needed for patient at these remote areas.
- The number of dental and pediatric patients serviced was below target.
 - Insufficient advertising
 - No company to service
